Parental Consultation.

Pupil Consultation.

SRE policy should reflect the views of pupils. listening and responding to the views of young people will strengthen their confidence and self-esteem.

Sex & Education Policy.

All schools must have an up-to-date SRE policy which is made for inspection and to parents.
OFSED is statutorily required under section 10 of the Schools inspection Act 1996 to evaluate and report on the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of pupils. This includes evaluating and commenting on a schools

SRE Delivery.

Qualified, knowledgeable, competent & capable of delivering aspects of SRE.
Appropriate language and resources.
Current and up to date information.
In line with the National Curriculum and School/Academy SRE policy.

Signposting to Services.

Signpost to local appropriate services that young people can access, in relation their their own Sexual Health.

Safe Guarding & Child Protection.

Set clear Confidentiality Policy.
Any personal disclosures, are dealt with appropriately. Child protection issues are addressed. Follow your own Child Protection procedures. Wherever possible the young person is encourage to talk with their parents /guardians, follow the Fraser Guidelines.

Evaluation.

Complete post session evaluation form.
Reflect and consult with school findings from evaluation.
